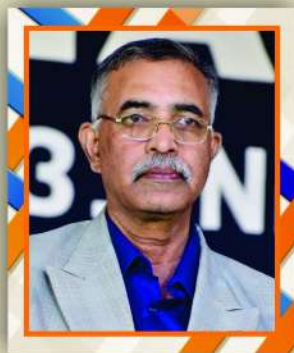

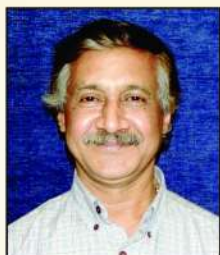

Music has many surprising benefits for children.

Through Music children develop spatial awareness, become less clumsy and pay more attention to others sharing their space. Children contest with language can express their feelings with immediacy through dance and movement, so always sing with your child. I have observed that singing with my kids at school improves their behaviour. It also helps them bond whatsoever the song or language. Musical activity involves many different parts of the brain.

In the home where there is music being played children automatically get drawn to it. I would like to share a personal experience at my school with a child who had a speaking problem but while singing I realized he could go through the entire song without faltering even once.

Kindergarten enjoys singing. They like songs that repeat words and melodies, use rhythms with a definite beat and ask them to do things. They enjoy rhymes and songs about familiar things like toys, animals, play activities and people.

Most of the children are intrigued by kids sing a long songs that involve counting, spellings, or remembering a sequence of events. Children begin expressing their likes and dislikes of different types of Music. They may express an interest in Music education such as Music lessons for kids.

As music ignites all the areas of child development and skills for school readiness including intellectual socio-emotional, Motor, language and overall literacy. So exposing children to music during early childhood helps them learn the sounds and meanings of words.
